### *Recessions, Depressions, & Automobiles*



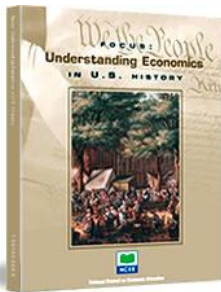

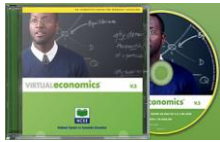
